CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT REGISTRATION NOTES

- All youth participants must be registered members of the BSA
- Webelos Scouts are encouraged to camp both nights with their affiliated Boy Scout Troop(s)
- Cub Scout Packs may register some of their boys to camp overnight on Saturday night and some of their boys to visit on Saturday
- Each camping Cub Scout must be accompanied by an adult (one-to-one). Due to space limitations, no other family members may camp with them. (See 'Cub Scout Camping' for more information)
- Reservations for Cub Scout camping will be apportioned based on the 'Hold-A-Place' responses and the district allocations. (See 'Cub Scout Camping' for more information)
- Please complete a 'Special Needs Request Form' (in the Appendix) for anyone needing special assistance.
- Call the Camping Department at the Council Service Center (816-942-9333) if you have any questions.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- **Registration** – All registration for the Campout will be done on-line. Any unit without internet access may come to the Council Service Center for assistance.
- **Latrines** - Portable latrines will be positioned in many locations in the Centennial Campground and at Naish Scout Reservation. In addition, the permanent latrines at Naish may also be used. All participants are urged to keep the latrine facilities as clean as possible. They will receive regular servicing during the weekend.
- **Showers** - No shower facilities will be available at the Campout.
- **Wash stands** – Wash stands will be located at various locations around the Centennial Campground and at Naish Scout Reservation.
- **Fresh Water** – Drinking water will be available at various locations in the Sub-Camps, around the Campground and at Naish Scout Reservation. Each participant is encouraged to bring a canteen or refillable water bottle.
- **Trash/Recycling** – Dumpsters will be located in each Sub-Camp. Please help keep our Campground and Naish SR 'green' by ensuring that all trash is deposited in a dumpster.
- **Fires** – There will be no fires allowed during the Campout. All meals will be provided and coffee will be available 24/7 at the Sub-Camp Headquarters areas. Open fires pose a significant risk in the case of dry weather. (See 'Food Service Procedures' for more information.)
- **Golf Carts/Bicycles** – No personal golf carts, gators, four-wheelers, bicycles, skateboards, or scooters, etc. will be allowed.

- **Identification** – At all times, each Campout participant MUST wear their wristband ID that will be provided. These bands will identify participants and allow access to the various areas of the Campout. They will be color-coded by Sub-Camp, parking lot, and buses. (See ‘Identification/Security Procedures’ for more information.)
- **Unit transportation** – All units are asked to carefully consider their transportation arrangements to their assigned remote parking lot for the Campout. Carpooling and/or the use of troop buses/vans is highly recommended - fewer vehicles result in less traffic. (See ‘Busing Procedures’ for more information.)
- **Security** – Security around the Campout will be handled by various law enforcement agencies.
- **Quiet hours** – All campers should be in their tents (except for necessary trips to the latrine) from 11:00 PM until reveille.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT RULES

- The Scout Oath, the Law of the Pack and the Outdoor Code serve as the ‘rule book’ for all Scouting events. In addition, the following rules must be observed:
 - No sheath knives, personal firearms or fireworks of any kind will be allowed at the Campout (in the possession of youth or adults). Any of the above items discovered will be confiscated and the responsible person(s) may be asked to leave the Campout.
 - No alcoholic beverages will be tolerated. Anyone, youth or adult, found to be in possession of them will be asked to leave the Campout.
 - No illegal drugs will be tolerated. Anyone, youth or adult, found to be in possession of these items will be turned over to law enforcement.
 - Drivers and passengers must wear seat belts at all times while riding in a vehicle. No persons should ride in cargo beds or sit loose in a van.
 - No fires of any kind will be permitted.
 - The policies outlined in ‘The Guide to Safe Scouting’ will be enforced throughout the Campout.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT UNIT INFORMATION PACKETS

Information packets for all units registered for the Campout will be distributed at the September Roundtables in each district. This includes the Packs, Troops, Teams, Crews, and Posts that will be camping as well as the Packs that will be visiting on Saturday.

The following items will be included in the Unit Information Packets according to the number of campers that have been registered for the Campout by the unit. The Information Packets will be color-coded to identify your Sub-Camp, buses, and parking lot.

- Wristbands (See 'Identification/Security Procedures' for more information)
- Patches
- Rockers (See 'Procedures for Action Areas/Midway & Display/Challenges' for more information)
- Passports (See 'Procedures for Action Areas/Midway & Display Area/Challenges' for more information)
- Maps – one for each Patrol/Den and one for the unit
- Schedules – one for each Patrol/Den and one for the unit

NOTE: To add participants who are not listed on your unit's Campout Registration (due by August 16th) and need to be added after that date, you can do so until Friday, September 24 by visiting Customer Service at the Council Service Center. Wristbands, patches, etc. for additions made before the date of your September Roundtable will be included in your Unit Information Packet that you will receive that night. Wristbands, patches, etc. for additions made after that date will be given to you at the time they are registered at the Council Service Center.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT 'WHAT TO BRING' PERSONAL GEAR

The following list is provided to assist campers in the selection of their personal gear. Refer to your Boy Scout Handbook for additional assistance.

- Completed 'Health and Medical Record' form (Available in the Appendix)
- Completed 'Departure Permission Form' (if you must leave the Campout prior to its conclusion, available in the Appendix)
- Uniform – Scout T-shirt during the day. Please wear full (Class A) uniforms to the Stage Show.
- Sleeping bag
- Appropriate clothing (it can get cold at night in late September)
- Appropriate walking shoes
- Rain gear
- Toiletries
- Personal first aid kit
- Canteen or water bottle
- Small flashlight
- Camera
- Money – for the Trading Post
- Pad or mat to sit on at the Stage Show

UNIT EQUIPMENT

- Tents
- Dining flies
- Lanterns
- Water jugs
- Gateway materials
- Items not to bring:
 - Cooking equipment/stoves
 - Cots

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT BUSING PROCEDURES

GENERAL INFORMATION

- All participants, including campers as well as Cub Scout Packs visiting on Saturday, will be transported to the Campground and/or Naish Scout Reservation on buses that will be provided.
- All parking will be in designated remote parking lots.
- No personal vehicles will be allowed in the Campground or at Naish Scout Reservation.
- Local roads around the Campground and Naish SR will be closed for the weekend. Only local residents and approved Campout support vehicles will be allowed on those roads.
- Once your unit has registered for the Campout, you will be assigned a Sub-Camp and a campsite.
- Your unit will also be assigned to a remote parking lot based on your Sub-Camp.
- Only personal gear (i.e. sleeping bags, backpacking tents, personal first aid kits, backpacks) will be allowed on the buses.
- No large unit equipment (i.e. tents, dining flies, gateway materials) will be allowed on the buses. It must be delivered to your campsite earlier in the week. (See 'Pre-Setup By Units' for more information)
- 24/7 security will be provided at each of the remote parking lots.

FOR TROOPS, TEAMS, CREWS, AND POSTS CAMPING TWO NIGHTS

- On Friday, September 24th, your unit should *arrive as a group* at your designated parking lot *at your assigned time* between 4:30 and 8:00 PM. (Note: any arrivals before 4:30 or after 8:00 must be arranged prior to the Campout weekend.)
- Buses will be provided to transport your campers and leaders to your Sub-Camp as a group. Please ensure that everyone in your unit is transported together. (Note: if you must have late arrivals, they can only arrive on Saturday morning by 12:00 noon.)
- A Commissioner will greet your unit at your parking lot and assist you with your bus transportation.
- A Commissioner will greet your unit upon arrival at your Sub-Camp and assist you with moving into your campsite.
- These same procedures will be followed in reverse on Sunday for your departure.

FOR PACKS CAMPING ON SATURDAY NIGHT

- On Saturday, September 25th, your Pack should *arrive as a group* at your designated parking lot *at your assigned time* between 7:30 A.M. and 9:30 A.M. (Note: any arrivals before 7:30 or after 9:30 must be arranged prior to the Campout weekend.)
- All other procedures are the same as outlined above for those camping two nights.

FOR PACKS VISITING ON SATURDAY

- All visiting Cub Scout Packs must register for the event.

- Upon registration, you will be assigned a designated parking lot.
- On Saturday, September 25th, your Pack should *arrive as a group* at your designated parking lot *at your assigned time* between 10:00 A.M. and 12:00 noon.
- Commissioners will greet you at the parking lot and at the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop in the Centennial Campground.
- Following the stage show (approximately 9:00 P.M. or later) you will board buses at the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop for transportation back to your parking lot.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT

BUS SCHEDULES

GENERAL INFORMATION

- All participants, including campers as well as Cub Scout Packs visiting on Saturday, will be transported to the Campground and/or Naish Scout Reservation on buses that will be provided.
- All parking will be in designated remote parking lots.
- No personal vehicles will be allowed in the Campground or at Naish SR.
- Local roads around the Campground and Naish SR will be closed for the weekend. Only local residents and approved Campout support vehicles will be allowed on those roads.
- Once your unit has registered for the Campout, you will be assigned a Sub-Camp and a campsite.
- Your unit will also be assigned to a remote parking lot based on your Sub-Camp.
- Only personal gear (i.e. sleeping bags, backpacking tents, backpacks) will be allowed on the buses.
- No large unit equipment (i.e. tents, dining flies, gateway materials) will be allowed on the buses. It must all be delivered to your campsite earlier in the week.
- 24/7 security will be provided at each of the remote parking lots.

COLOR IDENTIFICATION

- Each Sub-Camp will have a distinctive color identification that will be used for the campers' wristbands, assigned remote parking lots, and assigned buses.
- Those colors are as follow :
 - Metro Sub-Camp – Dark Green
 - East Sub-Camp – Light Green
 - Johnson Sub-Camp – Dark Brown
 - West Sub-Camp – Light Brown
 - Naish North Sub-Camp – Dark Blue
 - Naish South Sub-Camp – Light Blue
 - Visiting Cub Scout Packs – Purple
 - Midway and Display Area exhibitors and vendors – Orange
 - Visiting VIP's and Special Guests - Orange
 - Stage Show Event Staff and Talent - Orange
 - Campout Staff members – Red

FRIDAY EVENING

- From **4:30 P.M. until 8:00 P.M.**, buses will transport campers and their personal gear from the designated parking lots to the Sub-Camps in the Centennial Campground.
 - Any arrival times before or after these hours must be arranged prior to the Campout weekend.
 - Each unit must be transported as a *complete group*. (Note: If you must have late arrivals, they must arrive on Saturday morning by 12:00 noon.)

SATURDAY MORNING

- From **7:30 A.M. until 9:30 A.M.**, buses will transport Cub Scout campers and their personal gear from the designated parking lots to the Sub-Camps in Naish Scout Reservation.
 - Any arrival times before or after these hours must be arranged prior to the Campout weekend.

- Each Pack must be transported as a *complete group*. No late arrivals will be allowed after 12:00 noon.
- From **10:00 A.M. until 12:00 Noon**, buses will transport visiting Cub Scout Packs from the designated parking lot

to the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop in the Centennial Campground.

- Any arrival times before or after these hours must be arranged prior to the Campout weekend.
- Each Pack must be transported as a *complete group*. No late arrivals will be allowed after 12:00 noon.
- Also from **10:00 A.M. until 12:00 Noon**, buses will transport visiting VIP's and Special Guests from their designated parking lot to the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop. Buses will also be available to transport them back to their parking lot at the conclusion of their visit.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

- From **1:30 P.M. until 3:00 P.M.**, buses will transport visiting VIP's and Special Guests from their designated parking lot to the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop. Buses will also be available to transport them back to their parking lot at the conclusion of their visit.
- For campers who must leave, buses will transport them from their Sub-Camp bus stop to their remote parking lot.
- See the 'Policy for Participants Leaving and Returning'
- Buses will transport returning campers from their remote parking lot to their Sub-Camp bus stop
- See the 'Policy for Participants Leaving and Returning'

SATURDAY EVENING

- **Following the Stage Show**, campers from the Centennial Campground Sub-Camps will move back to their campsites. Cub Scout campers from Naish Scout Reservation Sub-Camps will walk back to Cub World. Upon arrival at Cub World, bus transportation will be provided from Cub World to South Camp for those Cub Scout Packs camping in that area.
- **Following the Stage Show**, buses will transport visiting Cub Scout Packs from the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop to their remote parking lot.

SUNDAY MORNING

- From **9:30 A.M. until 1:00 P.M.**, buses will transport departing campers from their Sub-Camps to their remote parking lots.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT FOOD SERVICE PROCEDURES

- Units camping two nights will need to provide dinner for their campers on Friday night. Either eat before arriving at your designated remote parking lot or bring sack suppers for everyone.
- All other meals are included as part of the Campout fee.
 - This includes *four meals* beginning with breakfast on Saturday and ending with breakfast on Sunday for Boy Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturers, Explorers, and their leaders *camping on Friday and Saturday nights*.
 - This includes *three meals* beginning with lunch on Saturday and ending with breakfast on Sunday for Cub Scouts and their adult partners and leaders who are *camping on Saturday night*.
 - And this includes *two meals* (lunch and dinner) for Cub Scout Packs *visiting on Saturday*.
- The intent is to make mealtimes quick and simple and to allow maximum time for the Scouts to experience the many opportunities that will be available to them at the Campout.
- Units should not bring any cooking equipment or attempt to prepare any additional meals in their campsites.
- No fires of any kind will be permitted.
- Water will be available at various locations throughout the Campground and each camper

should bring a refillable water bottle.

- All meals will be pre-packaged and delivered to the Sub-Camps.
- At the designated times prior to each meal, units will send Scouts and leaders to the distribution site in the Sub-Camp to pick-up their food. It is recommended that this be done by patrol or den.
- For lunch on Saturday, adequate time will be scheduled to allow Boy Scouts, Webelos Scouts, and leaders to return to their campsites for lunch.
- Lunch for Venturers and Explorers will be available at the Central Camp Dining Hall at Naish Scout Reservation (near the pool where their Challenge Events are held) and their dinner will be available in their Sub-Camp.
- Lunch for camping Cub Scout Packs will be available in their Sub-Camps at Naish SR and their dinner will be available at the Midway in the Centennial Campground. (Note: This is necessary because there will not be enough time for them to return to Naish SR for dinner and then return to the Centennial Campground for the Stage Show.)
- Lunch and Dinner for Cub Scout Packs visiting on Saturday will be available at the Display Area in the Centennial Campground.
- Trash disposal and recycling facilities will be conveniently located in each Sub-Camp.
- Snack food items will be available for purchase in each of the Trading Posts at the Centennial Campground and at Naish Scout Reservation.
- Coffee will be available at all times in the Sub-Camp Headquarters Areas.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT PRE-SETUP & POST-TAKEDOWN BY UNITS

NOTE: Due to the large number of units and campers that will be attending this very special event, it is necessary to have extraordinary procedures in place to ensure an orderly and safe weekend. Your understanding and cooperation is essential and is deeply appreciated.

CENTENNIAL CAMPGROUND

- Upon registration, Troops, Teams, Crews, and Posts will be assigned to a Sub-Camp and campsite based on their number of campers attending and their district affiliation.
- All units must deliver their unit equipment (i.e. tents, dining flies, and gateway materials) to the Campground prior to the Campout weekend (note: this does not include personal gear such as sleeping bags, backpacking tents, personal first aid kits, and backpacks).
- Units are encouraged to limit their equipment for the weekend to tents, dining flies, and gateway materials (note: all meals are provided as part of the Campout fee so no cooking equipment is needed and no fires of any kind will be permitted).
- Beginning on Saturday, September 18th through Tuesday, September 21st, units will bring their equipment to the Campground.
- See the accompanying chart for the day(s) for your district's equipment delivery. A specific day will be assigned to each unit based on your district.
- You may request a specific time for you to deliver your unit equipment. If do not have a preference, a time will be assigned to your unit. If the assigned time does not work for you, please contact the Camping Department at the Council Service Center (816-942-9333).
- No personal vehicles or troop trailers will be permitted in the camping areas during the equipment delivery as well as during the Campout weekend. Equipment trailers may be brought to your designated remote parking lot on Friday when you arrive for the Campout to have them available to transport your large equipment after the Campout on Sunday. They must be left in the parking lot and 24/7 security will be provided.
- Upon arrival at the Sub-Camp equipment drop-off area on their assigned day and time, units will be met by a camp vehicle that will transport the equipment to their assigned campsite.

- Campsites will provide approximately 100 square feet per camper.
- After delivery, units have the option to set up their equipment at that time or to wait until their arrival for the Campout on Friday, September 24th. Weather forecasts and the type of unit equipment being used should be considered in making this decision. If the decision is to wait, units should cover their gear with tarps or other protection from the elements.
- 24/7 security will be in place at the Campground beginning on Saturday, September 18th through Tuesday, September 28th.
- On Sunday, September 26th, after the closing of the Campout and upon their departure, campers should take all personal gear and small unit equipment items with them.
- Large items, such as tents, dining flies, and gateway materials must be left for removal after all campers have departed.
- As with equipment delivery, camp vehicles will assist with large unit equipment removal.
- Large items may begin being removed at 1:00 P.M. on Sunday with priority given to those units that have the furthest to travel.
- All unit equipment items must be removed by 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday, September 28th.

NAISH SCOUT RESERVATION

- The procedures for the delivery and removal of the unit equipment of the Packs camping on Saturday night will mirror the procedures outlined above.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT

MEDICAL AND EMERGENCY INFORMATION

- Units should bring Health and Medical Record forms for all campers. They will be kept in the campsites by the units.
- The Health and Medical Record forms used for summer camp may be used. For Cub Scouts and new Scouts, see the Appendix for the form.
- Visitors will not need to have Health and Medical Record forms.
- First Aid for injuries will be available at each Sub-Camp Headquarters Area.
- Emergency cases will be transported by on-site ambulances to the KU Trauma Center.
- Life Flight will be on call.
- An evacuation plan in case of severe weather or other disaster has been developed in cooperation with the Wyandotte County Emergency Management and will be shared at the Crackerbarrels on Friday night.
- All registered youth and adults will be covered by the council's Sickness and Accident Insurance. The limits of this coverage can be found on the council's website.
- Each unit must have one designated cell phone number for use by parents in an emergency or by the Sub-Camp in an emergency. There will be a place to list it on your unit's Registration form for the Campout.
- The Campout emergency number is the Naish Scout Reservation number: (913) 422-1035.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT POLICY FOR PARTICIPANTS LEAVING AND RETURNING

Note: While it is encouraged that all campers (youth and adult) stay at the Campout for the duration

of the event, it is recognized that circumstances may dictate that someone must leave and later return. For safety and security reasons, it is essential that the following procedures be followed.

Your understanding and cooperation is greatly appreciated.

- It is highly encouraged that all campers stay at the Campout from their arrival until its conclusion.
- All personal vehicles will be parked in designated remote parking lots. No personal vehicles will be allowed at the Campground or at Naish Scout Reservation. All roads around the Campground and Naish SR will be closed to all but local residents and approved Campout support vehicles.
- Transportation to and from the Sub-Camps and the designated parking lots will be by provided buses.
- If a camper has no other choice and must leave during the Campout, a 'Departure Permission Form' (which can be found in the Appendix) must be completed and signed (by a parent if for a youth member) prior to arriving at the Campout.
- A departing camper must report to the Sub-Camp bus stop for transportation to the parking lot.
- A Commissioner will be at the Sub-Camp bus stop to check the 'Departure Permission Form' before allowing the camper to board a bus.
- If the departing camper is a Cub Scout, he must be accompanied by his adult partner.
- If the departing camper is a youth, the responsible adult (at least 18 years of age) listed on the 'Departure Permission Form' must meet him/her at the time of their de-boarding of the bus at the parking lot. If the responsible adult is not present, the youth camper will be returned to the Sub-Camp and re-admitted to the Campout.
- Another Commissioner will meet the departing camper at the parking lot and secure a signature from the responsible adult confirming that the youth camper is now their responsibility.
- If the departing camper is an adult, the steps outlined above will be followed with the exception that the adult can sign themselves out.
- The camper will return to their designated parking lot to be picked up by a bus to return to the Campout. A Commissioner will meet them at the parking lot to confirm their return.
- Another Commissioner will meet them upon their arrival at the Sub-Camp to see that they safely return to their campsite where a leader will acknowledge their return.
- It is critically important that we know at all times who is on site and who has departed.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT IDENTIFICATION/SECURITY PROCEDURES

- All participants, whether youth or adult, will be issued a colored wristband that must be worn for the duration of the Campout.
- The identification wristband colors are –
 - Dark Green – Boy Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Venturers, Explorers and their leaders in the Metro Sub-Camp
 - Light Green – Boy Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Venturers, Explorers and their leaders in the East Sub-Camp
 - Dark Brown – Boy Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Venturers, Explorers and their leaders in the Johnson Sub-Camp
 - Light Brown – Boy Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Venturers, Explorers and their leaders in the West Sub-Camp
 - Dark Blue – Camping Cub Scouts and their parents and leaders in the North Naish Sub-Camp
 - Light Blue – Camping Cub Scouts and their parents and leaders in the South Naish Sub-Camp
 - Purple – Visiting Cub Scouts, their parents, and leaders
 - Red – Campout Staff members
 - Orange – Stage Show event staff and talent, visiting VIP's and special guests, and Midway and Display Area exhibitors and vendors
- Wristbands will be distributed to all participating units (those camping as well as those visiting) at the September Roundtables in each district as part of the Campout Information Packet.
- Wristbands and parking passes will be mailed to all VIP's and special guests, Stage Show staff and talent, medical staff, and all exhibitors and vendors.
- All Sub-Camps, remote parking lots and buses will be color-coded accordingly to ensure you will be boarding a bus that will deliver you to the correct Sub-Camp or parking lot.
- Any individual found at the Campout without a wristband will be escorted from the premises by security.

CENTENNIAL CAMPOUT COMMISSIONERS' RESPONSIBILITIES

- Commissioners will be in place at the bus stops in the remote parking lots beginning on Friday at 4:00 P.M. for these purposes –
 - On Friday evening, be responsible for the bus operation in their parking lot, assisting arriving Troops, Teams, Crews, and Posts and checking wristbands.
 - On Saturday morning, be responsible for the bus operation in their parking lot, assisting arriving Cub Scout Packs that will be camping and assisting arriving Cub Scout Packs that will be visiting for the day and checking wristbands.
 - On Saturday, ensure that every departing camper has a properly signed 'Departure Permission Form' and that no youth camper is allowed to de-board a bus unless their designated responsible adult is present to pick him/her up and signs the 'Departure Permission Form'

- On Saturday, ensure that every camper who departed has returned by their estimated return time. If not, make calls to the parents and/or the designated responsible adult.
- On Saturday, initial the 'Departure Permission Form' for all returning campers and send the 'Departure Permission Form' with them back to their Sub-Camp.
- Commissioners will be in place at the bus stops in the Sub-Camps beginning on Friday at 4:00 P.M. for these purposes –
 - On Friday evening in the Centennial Campground Sub-Camps, greet each arriving Troop, Team, Crew, and Post and assist them with moving into their campsites.
 - On Saturday morning in the Naish Scout Reservation Sub-Camps, greet each arriving Pack and assist them with moving into their campsites.
 - On Saturday morning at the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop, greet each arriving Pack that is visiting for the day and assist them as needed.
 - On Saturday, ensure that every departing camper has a properly signed 'Departure Permission Form' and that no youth camper is allowed to board a bus without one.
 - On Saturday, greet all returning campers, escort youth campers back to their Sub-Camp, and get their unit leader to sign the 'Departure Permission Form' to verify that they have safely returned.
- On Friday evening, Commissioners will assist with any registration adjustments that must be made at the Crackerbarrels in each Centennial Campground Sub-Camp.
- Other Commissioners will be assigned to a group of campsites in each Sub-Camp. They will serve as 'Camp Commissioners' for the units in those campsites.
- On Saturday between 10:00 A.M. -- 12:00 Noon and between 1:30 P.M. -- 3:00 P.M., Commissioners will greet and assist arriving VIP's and Special Guests at the bus stop in their designated remote parking lot. Other Commissioners will greet arriving VIP's and Special Guests at the Metro Sub-Camp bus stop and direct them to the Reception Area at the Campout Headquarters Area. This process will be reversed as the VIP's and Special Guests depart.
- On Saturday evening, Commissioners will coordinate the mobilization and movement of the units in their Sub-Camp to the Stage Show Area.
- Also on Saturday evening, following the Stage Show, Commissioners from each Sub-Camp will be in place at the 'Lost Scout' area near the Stage Show area to assist lost campers in returning to their campsites.
- On Sunday morning, Commissioners will assist their units in moving to the chapel services.
- On Sunday morning, Commissioners will be in place at the bus stops in the Sub-Camps beginning at 9:00 A.M. to assist units with their departure from the Sub-Camps and their return to their designated remote parking lot.
- On Sunday morning, Commissioners will be in place at the bus stops in the remote parking lots beginning at 9:00 A.M. to assist units as they return from their Sub-Camps for departure.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Campers will need to be moved en masse from their campsites for the Saturday evening Stage Show and the Sunday morning Chapel Services.
- The Commissioners will have the responsibility of organizing, coordinating, and overseeing these movements.

STAGE SHOW

- At 5:30 P.M., campers in the Centennial Campground Sub-Camps will begin moving from their Sub-Camps to the Stage Show Area under the direction of their Commissioners.

- At 6:00 P.M., campers from the Naish Scout Reservation Sub-Camps as well as the visiting Cub Scout Packs will move into the Stage Show Area (they will already be in the vicinity having dinner).
- Entry into the Stage Show Area and seating will be as follows:
 - Campers from the Johnson Sub-Camp will enter the Stage Show Area from the southwest and be seated in that area.
 - Campers from the West Sub-Camp will enter the Stage Show Area from the west and be seated in that area.
 - Campers from the Metro Sub-Camp will enter the Stage Show Area from the north and be seated in that area.
 - Campers from the East Sub-Camp will enter the Stage Show Area from the southeast and be seated in that area.
 - Campers from the Naish SR Sub-Camps will enter the Stage Show Area from the northeast and be seated in that area.
 - Visiting Cub Scouts, parents, and leaders will also enter the Stage Show Area from the northeast and be seated in that area.
- Following the Stage Show, campers from the Centennial Campground Sub-Camps will move back to their campsites. Cub Scout campers from the Naish Scout Reservation Sub-Camps will walk to Cub World. Upon arrival at Cub World, bus transportation will be provided from Cub World to South Camp for those Cub Scout Packs camping in that area.

CHAPEL SERVICES

- At 7:00 A.M., units will move to the Chapel Service of their choice under the direction of their Commissioners.

- Any amount of a district's allocation not reserved by August 16th will be released to be assigned to a district that needs additional space.
- All Packs will arrive on Saturday morning. Those camping will depart on Sunday and those visiting will depart after the Stage Show on Saturday night.
- All parking will be at an assigned remote parking lot and everyone will be transported to the Campout location on provided buses.
- Pick-up times at the parking lots will be assigned to each Pack (for those camping and for those visiting) for Saturday morning and for departure on Sunday (for those camping). This schedule must be followed to insure an orderly arrival and departure for several thousand campers.
- No personal vehicles will be allowed in the Centennial Campground/Naish Scout Reservation area.
